Our environment

Hardwick House School delivers an inspiring curriculum where education is centred around the specific learning difficulties associated with autism.

Learners are given opportunities to engage in sensory experiences which are integrated within the curriculum and during tailored sessions. These experiences have a positive impact on well-being, also helping learners to develop skills and to desensitise against areas that they may struggle with.

Key Stage 2 are located within their own purpose-built area on the school site. Pupils integrate with the older cohorts under supervision and have access to all facilities with the security of their own learning hub. Subjects are taught through a topic centred programme of study.

Secondary and beyond

Core subjects are taught discreetly alongside a range of subjects, progressing to GCSE qualifications at Key Stage 4. There are further opportunities for learners to improve their Level 2 achievements whilst exploring a range of transition options, including vocational work, ready for life after Hardwick House School.

Personalised support

Personalised approaches are developed for each learner within the structure of the timetable, allowing for changes to lesson delivery and activities across the week. Complementing our academic content, students access lessons in Key Skills and Life skills, with occupational therapy and counselling support also available.

Communication

The Communication aspect of the Hardwick House curriculum is focused on developing the key skills associated with becoming an independent and effective communicator in modern society with real life employability prospects. Each student receives weekly Social Communication lessons delivered by school staff and our Speech and Language Therapist.

Outdoor Learning

The school's outdoor learning facilities are used to promote creative thinking, enhance well-being and grow each learner's confidence.

Community skills are built into the timetable for all of our children, from weekly off-site visits in Key Stage 2 through to life skills and travel training visits in our secondary classes.

The campfire kitchen area is used for life skills and as a tool for teaching, and our pupils can also enjoy physical contact with a variety of animals in order to reduce anxiety, learn about habitats, and become fully involved in their care and upkeep.








Transition and celebrating success

The measures of success for our young people are diverse. Whilst all of our pupils aspire to achieve qualifications and grades, it is often the personal accomplishments that occur on a daily basis that are the most fulfilling.

We set aspirational yet achievable targets for all of our pupils, and our curriculum allows our children to attain GCSE qualifications comparable to that of a mainstream education. Many pupils at Hardwick House are able to study towards 8 or 9 GCSEs.



Through regular reviews and contact with home, we are able to make adjustments to the path our young people are taking, at any stage of the journey.

When pupils leave Hardwick House School they are prepared for their next step towards independent adulthood and able to access further education or enter the workplace.

After you have visited Hardwick House School and are confident that you would like to pursue a place, you will need to liaise with the local authority to provide us with as much information as possible, including a copy of your child's EHCP and any recent assessments.

We will come out to visit your child in their current educational setting, whether this is at school or in the home. This is to make an initial assessment of their communication skills, academic and social needs. We will then invite you to return to the school for a visit with your child, where they are able to see and experience the school for themselves. After this, we are able to reply to a consultation.

Learners can be transitioned into the school at any point and are encouraged to build up gradually to full time attendance.

We welcome visitors to the school and run individual tours each week for prospective parents. Please contact us to book a place.
